Biographical sketch: Jackson Pind, a Laurentian University Alumni is a mixed Settler-Anishinaabe Historian of Indigenous education. While studying at Laurentian University (2016-2017) during the summer of 2016, he worked as the first Aboriginal Heritage liaison for the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters Heritage Centre (in Peterborough).

After graduating in 2017 (Masters of Arts, History Laurentian University) he enrolled at Queen's University to pursue his studies in History/Education (doctorate). In 2017 he earned the Ontario Graduate Scholarship, and the following year the Government of Canada History Award and subsequently a SSHRC-CGS scholarship (2019-2021) for his research on Indigenous education. He is an editor on *Spirit of the Grassroots People: Seeking Justice for Indigenous Survivors of Canada's Colonial Education System* (MQUP, October 2020). Jackson also teaches part-time at Fleming College in the Indigenous Studies program.

Scope and content: The Jackson Pind Fonds consists in a transcription of an interview he did with Mike Harris (former Premier) while researching for his Master's thesis. The interview is relating to Education policies and Ernie Checkeris. An autographed copy of *Spirit of the Grassroots People*, edited by Jackson Pind and Theodore Michael Christou is also part of the fonds.
